Drug Project- Part 2: The Presentation

Next, you will collaborate with several people, who share a drug in your category, to create an introductory presentation about your drug's UNIQUE characteristics & "personality."

Each group will "teach" the rest of the class about their drug through this "acting/skit" activity. Your group will use class time and possibly some "home" time to complete your presentation. You may choose to record your presentation at home or in school and edit accordingly.

	Act out 4 out of the 6 situations below:
	Act out the thought process of a person who is trying to resist the "peer pressure" to use drugs.
	Instead of agreeing to use drugs, act out 3 different REALISTIC ways to REFUSE drugs without being considered "uncool."
	Expose at least 3 different negative "everyday" outcomes of your groups drug usage.
	Act out the "health triangle" affects your drugs cause the user.
	Act out the reasons "WHY" someone might use your particular drug grouping and place emphasis on the unhealthy results.
	Act out HOW a person/group might help a drug user get on the drug free path.
> 5	Skit format suggestions:
	Guest interview format (Doprah, Dr. Pill Show, Ellen Drugerness) where a host interviews recovering addicts along with treatment counselors, doctors, etc.
	Game show format-Smarter than and 8th grader, Jeopardy, group designed, etc.
	Create your own MOVIE (Harry Potter, Hunger Games), TV drama (CSI), Reality show (Real World, Jersey Shore, Intervention), or CARTOON (SpongeBob, Dora)
_	format complete with characters & real life drug scenarios.
